Colonel Peter M. Maunz is the Deputy Director of Headquarters, Air Combat Command, Acquisition Management and Integration Center (AMIC). His responsibilities include senior business and technical leadership within the command for all outsourced major operations and maintenance programs, and the Combat Air Forces Engineering and Technical Services (AFETS) program. Leadership responsibilities of this unique multi-function organization include cradle to grave acquisition and program management of weapon systems supporting such programs as Predator/Reaper Maintenance, War Reserve Materiel (WRM), Tethered Aerostat Radar System, Counterdrug Surveillance and Control System, Counterdrug Forward Operating Locations, Icelandic Air Defense System, Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance, North Warning System, Precision Measurement and Equipment Laboratories, and other multifunctional programs valued at over \$5 billion.

Driving Directions:

1. From Points East, take I-264 traveling West, take the exit onto Hampton Roads Belt/I-64 W toward Richmond. Make a slight left at I-564 W. Continue at Step 5 below.
2. From Points South, travel West on I-64 towards Richmond, then Continue at Step 5 below.
3. From Points West, travel I- 64 East, through the HRBT and exit onto 564 West: Continue at Step 5 below.
4. From Points North, travel I-664 (Outer Loop) to I-264 East, then exit I-64 West: Continue at Step 5 below.
5. Follow signs for I-564 W (VA-406/Naval Base/I-564/Terminal Blvd)
